Vigorous Convent: The World Visits GF at Klostergut Paradies

Vibrant Industry: Visualizing the Corporate Archive of Georg Fischer Ltd

The GF Corporate Archive – a cultural asset of national significance – has been located at Klostergut Paradies since 1948. Its treasures include about 130,000 photographs. Famous photographers such as Jakob Tuggener and Max Graf followed the development of GF and their photo reportages are unique documents of technological and industrial history. Many of the photographs in this exhibition are being shown for the first time in public. The photographers' cameras bring to life the vivid history of Schaffhausen's industry in the 20th century.

Vigorous Convent – Vibrant Industry: 100 Years of GF at Klostergut Paradies

Anniversary exhibition March 19 – November 12, 2018

In 1918, Georg Fischer Ltd (GF) purchased the former Poor Clares convent Paradies in Schlatt (TG). For many years, GF used this building to house employees, later it served as an accommodation for retirees, and after World War II it was repurposed in part as the seat of the Iron Library Foundation. The GF Corporate Archive was allocated needed space here in 1948. Since 1974, the carefully restored convent building has served mainly as the training center for GF. This exhibition tells the one-hundred year history of GF at Klostergut Paradies.
